ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2024 MEDICAL SCIENTISTS ASSOCIATION OF VICTORIA THURSDAY 14 NOVEMBER 2024 @ 6.30PM

AGM Meeting held in person at Solidarity Hall, Trades Hall

1. Opening of meeting by President Cathy Durkin

Acknowledgement of Country and opening remarks

President Cathy Durkin opened the meeting at 6.46pm and thanked members for their attendance in person at Solidarity Hall. Cathy thanked the MSAV team including Matt, Lisa, Conor, Lyzz, Paul, Chloe, Anastasia and Alex for all their work in support of union members.

Cathy also thanked our MSAV Committee members who volunteer their time to provide support and governance to the Union. We are stronger for the support you provide.

3. Welcome and Address by MSAV Secretary Matt Hammond

The year ending 30 June 2023 was, by most metrics, a good one for the MSAV.

At the end of June 2023, we had 1768 members which grew to 1885 by end of June 2024, an increase of 117 members or a 6.7% increase in membership for the year. This growth was in no small part due to the strong bargaining campaign at Melbourne Pathology where members stood strong, took stop work action (a first for our union in more than a decade) and fought actively for better pay and conditions.

Our finances also had a significant turnaround, from a deficit of more than \$120 000 to a surplus of \$44 000.

We have negotiated 7 Enterprise Agreements and recovered around \$400 k of underpayments for members.

We have continued to do the day in day out work of dealing with organisational change, representing members with conduct and performance issues, helping to achieve workplace flexibility outcomes, fighting for better rosters better health and safety and providing all those other important services to members.

We have purchased new merchandise – the union t-shirts and orange pens have been really well regarded by members and help improve the visibility of the union in the workplace.

The coming year will again be a big year for the Union, with public sector bargaining, Lifeblood and private pathology bargaining and a renewed focus on pathology reform in a way that (hopefully) we can now properly get behind.
